



Emerging Practitioners in Philanthropy-Professional Development Fund

Designed to increase access to professional development conferences and trainings for emerging philanthropic practitioners, with an emphasis on supporting the leadership and the retention of young people of color in the field, the PDF will provide partial funding for recipients to participate in one professional conference or training in the foundation field. Examples of appropriate conferences and trainings include, but are not limited to: Affinity Group or Regional Associations of Grantmakers conferences; Council on Foundations conferences (Annual, Family, or Community Foundations) or institutes (for New Grantmakers or Trustees); trainings by philanthropy advocacy groups (such as Alliance for Justice); and grantmaker education trainings (such as The Grantmaking School or GrantCraft). In addition to helping participants attend their conference of choice, EPIP will provide a gathering for all Fund recipients so that they meet one another and other peers, gain value from EPIP's internal professional development programs, and learn more about resources available across the field.

This program offers activists and organizers of color with extensive experience in the fields of social and economic justice, the opportunity to gain exposure to donor-advised philanthropy and build their knowledge and skills in social change grantmaking. The program is designed to provide the Fellow with the opportunity to draw on her/his on-the-ground experience to inform and enrich the foundation's programs and grantmaking. Tides provides the necessary support and training to enable the Fellow to enter the field of philanthropy at the end of her/his term, or return to her/his community work with a strong understanding of the philanthropic sector.

The Fellowship is a two-year program and supervised by a Philanthropic Advisor.
